

Siân Jones graduated in law from Manchester University in 1980 and was called to the Bar the following year. She worked as a barrister in Yorkshire until 1983 when she joined the magistrates' courts service as a court clerk at Kidderminster. This was followed by five turbulent years at Birmingham magistrates' court, followed by service as Principal Court Clerk in Solihull, and as Deputy Justices' Clerk in North East Wales. She was appointed Justices' Clerk for Cleveland in 2004.

She was a member of the JCS legal aid network from 1996 until it was wound up, when she transferred to the criminal law network. As a member of the criminal law network she was one of the authors of the Good Practice Guide to Taxation.

Siân was elected to the Council of the Justices' Clerks' Society in May 2007 and was elected Vice President in 2010. She was chair of the Judicial and Procedural Committee from 2008, and works closely with HMCS and NOMS on fines and breach enforcement. She was also active in developing the Justices' Clerks' peer review scheme.
